September Chapter Meeting and Members' Recital—Hill Scholarship

Michael Vance Hill was an organist, church musician, and active member of the Greater Greensboro Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Mike worked tirelessly for the Chapter, serving in many capacities. During his tenure as Dean, he was the instigator and organizer of ten annual AGO concerts designed to raise funds for Hospice chapters in the Triad. These concerts usually involved other area instrumentalists, which served to expand the community interest in the concerts. Inspired by these concerts and by Mike's dedication to furthering the cause of the organ in our community, the GGAGO Board voted to create a scholarship in his honor to encourage organ study by students in grades 6-12. The scholarship continues under the governance of the Piedmont NC Chapter of the AGO.

On Friday, September 7 at 7pm, the Chapter is sponsoring a recital to benefit the Hill Scholarship fund. The concert is at First Baptist Church, 1000 West Friendly Avenue in Greensboro. Organists from Winston-Salem and Greensboro will play; John Alexander, First Presbyterian, Greensboro; Bill Allred, Guilford Park

Presbyterian, Greensboro; John Cummins, Saint Paul's Episcopal, Winston-Salem; Lauren Winkleman, Knollwood Baptist, Winston-Salem. Donations made at the recital support the Michael Hill Scholarship fund for young organists.

At the mid-point of the recital the Chapter will convene briefly for its annual meeting and Officer Installation. A light reception will follow the recital. Make plans now to attend the recital and first meeting of the 2018-19 season.

The Piedmont NC Chapter of the AGO is sponsoring a workshop for piano students, elementary through high school. Participants will learn about the organ, its history, repertoire, and mechanical aspects. Students will have opportunity to explore the innerworkings of the organ and to sit at the console and try out piano pieces they already play. Some students may choose to participate in an informal recital at the end of the day.

Leading the class are Dr. André Lash, Lecturer of Organ at the University of North Carolina Greensboro and Dr. Timothy Olsen, Kenan Professor of Organ at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts and Associate Professor of Organ at Salem College in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Students will work with these teachers in small groups and individually during the course of the event.

All levels of experience are welcome, beginning through advanced students. The event is free and lunch is provided. Prospective students may register online.


